<u>MAP Testing:</u> Students in grades 6, 7, and 8 are working to complete end-of-year MAP tests (Measures of Academic Progress) in the areas of Reading, Math, and Language Usage. Score reports will be shared with parents after testing concludes. Teachers use MAP data to identify skills that need reteaching. MAP data can also be used to create more personalized learning plans for students.

Applying to NHS or NJHS: Students in grades 9 through 11 who wish to apply for National Honor Society membership should drop by the Secondary Office to pick up an application. The same applies to students in grades 6 through 8 who wish to apply to National Junior Honor Society.
